WA STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS 09 CLUB CLASS PERSPECTIVE

This years event being the Pathfinders Club turn and was set at Woodindale Rd property of the McKay's in Toodyay. This property has offered many an event in Prestige trials over the years and a previous championship held here also. Having ridden here before, I guessed pretty much where sections would have to be set, but not sure of the degree of difficulty on the day or the direction of the lap. Being a one off Championship, it means you need to get it right on the day and preparation was the key.

Organisation by the club was fantastic, well done to all the officials, observers for every section and punchers where possible. MWA was represented by Darrel Holman, and Sue Baldwin's first role as COC. Many other helpers were officiated at some level also, quite a collective effort. Healthways Smokefree was the main sponsor, but had little influence to smokers around the paddock. Portaloo's were provided by Steve (Kenny) Cox via the hire company he works for and made for a professional look with the bunting around. Some of the spectators about were ex trials club members and visitors being local and many on road bikes come up for a look. Also out and about was the TV crew for On Two Wheels, whom some may have seen on Foxtel on Aurora Channel earlier in the year, and around at the recent Perth Bike and Scooter Show. It was good that they made the effort and to give our State Championship's a plug on a national TV show. I will try and find out when it will be run, possibly early next year I think to how it was seen this year.

I was going to give the States a decent attempt, and in preparation doing some exercise to up the fitness level, and the weekend prior to the States I was out practicing and hurt my back, pulling the same back injury I did in July. Having worked the whole week and no time for proper treatment and finishing nightshift the day prior, I was not feeling that confident now on the day, and wondered how long my back would hold up. I soon found out on the first lap walking the sections required jumping across the small water steam here and there, I was now already starting to stiffen up. My first lap was pretty ordinary, and I wasn't moving around on the bike comfortably and reflected in my lap score, including a silly five when trying to get back on the line between rocks and stalled the bike. By the second lap I loosened up and tried to remain positive to finish this way, even if not comfortable with the pain.

The sections for Club Class were a little easy and was reflected in the overall scores. They were fairly tight by days end, which meant you had to concentrate to ride consistently well technically over the whole event, try not to lose minor points that add up or a big score in a single section that can push you back a place in one lap. There


was nothing hard or big or dangerous in the sections at all, just a few technical negotiations here and there, not too much of a point splitter really as more technique required to clean. Some sections were longer than we normally see, more for a spectator point of view, but did catch out the odd rider not remembering were to go late in the day for being so long!

The weather forecast for the day was showers and expected thunderstorms, which luckily did not eventuate more than the odd wet period at times. It did play a part in the sections ridden at the time making them a little slippery, and getting my jacket out of the backpack I was carrying. By the first lap Mike Thorpe had a clean lap, and the rest of us either improved from there or progressively worse as the day wore on. By halfway after a bite to eat I was refueled and wanted to get back out before my back stiffened and got cold, and encouraged Frank Ginty to get the next two laps done to finish. The scores between riders in the last two laps meant any points lost would be a decider, and clean laps for lan Moon paid well in his result for a deserved first place. Martin Softley who lan was riding with, thanked Ian for pushing him all day to get a second position. Third place for me was sort of a hollow victory, as all the preparation I started out with was then compromised by my injured back and took the position by a countback for a solitary clean over John McGlone. That has been the usual placing for me missing a position by a countback over the years, so something came of the effort, much a surprise to me at the presentation, and sorry to John for being decided that way as he rode really well.

The other grades of what I saw lapping around were awesome, as I saw a lot of the A Grade riders and Lewis Nolan was out with some attack since only returning from Spain days before. Josh Austin put in a big effort and did well to finish. As the lap and sections were big, I didn't get too much of the other lines being ridden, but noted that the Blue line had some tough bits in it here and there.

On the day a spectator was pointed out to look for me to ask for Twinshock info, I wasn't approached, so if anyone has details or know who he was, can you please let me know.



SunSmart Sport

Australia has the highest rate of skin cancer in the world. This is largely due to our climate, the fact that many of us have fair skin that isn't suited to such harsh conditions, our proximity to the equator and our love of the great outdoors.

The Cancer Council Australia recommends Australians take five steps to protect against sun damage when the SunSmart UV Index is at 3 (moderate) or above:



Slip on some sun-protective clothing that covers as much skin as possible.



Slop on SPF 30+ sunscreen - make sure it's broad spectrum and water resistant. Put it on 20 minutes before you go outdoors and every two hours.



Slap on a hat that protects your face, head, neck and ears.



Seek shade - make use of natural and built shade or bring your own.



Slide on sunglasses - close fitting styles offer the best protection. Make sure your sunglasses meet Australian standards.

Extra care should be taken between **10am to 3pm** when UV Index levels reach their peak.

So next time you're playing, officiating or watching outdoor sport **Be Sunsmart** and reduce your risk of skin damage and skin cancer.

The weather was fine for the event start on Sun after a very cold night when there was ice on the campers' windscreens & in water dishes. We (Richard & me) were disappointed in our selves for setting S4 a little tight for the white line. Remember how I said it was a cold start to the day well it got much colder. On the 3rd section I attempted for the day I clipped my handlebars on the rock ledge (there was a narrow line between the ledge & waterhole) & in I went for a dip, thanks to Lewis for the hand out & the other guys around --- jeans stay wet for a long time--- Mike Thorpe had also come to the same grief as me but worse he had drowned his bike. The Perth Motorcycle and Scooter Show is a Bi-annual event and was held for the second time at the Perth Convention Centre. I didn't do the last show at the Convention Centre but this years show seemed to be quite successful with what looked like good numbers turning out despite the bad weather, it was good to be indoors. We had a good size area for our demo but as it was a shared area with the MX Freestyle boys and the scooter come & test ride. it wasn't ideally set up right. Apart from the 4 demos per day the boys also did 3 interviews per day up on the centre stage. At the end of each interview Neil would bunny hop sideways off the end of the stage. 
